

The region's severe drought continues.

Lakes Buchanan and Travis, the two water supply reservoirs in the Highland Lakes, are stressed by the current drought.

Per LCRA, **once per week watering** schedules are triggered anytime the combined storage of lakes Buchanan and Travis is below 900,000 acre-feet, or about 45% of capacity. **Storage When Full - 1,995,432**

February 26, 2024 - 846,195 acre-feet

Conservation is essential to protect and extend water supplies.

According to the EPA, outdoor watering can account for up to 70% of home water use during the hot summer season.

Effective March 1, 2024

Once per week watering on designated day and time.

*Failure to adopt, implement, and enforce the LCRA watering restrictions subjects WCID 1 & 2 to daily LCRA penalties of thousands of dollars <u>per day</u>.









Small changes can mean BIG results.

Fix Leaks!

Add mulch to landscape beds and compost to turf areas to keep plants healthy and prevent

water loss through evaporation.



Watering before sunrise

- Minimizes water lost to evaporation
- More water is absorbed

Cover swimming pools to reduce evaporation.

Check for runoff or ponding when irrigation runs. Divide runtime into shorter cycles to apply, allow time to soak-in, and apply again. Some irrigation controllers have a specific

feature for cycle and soak.



Turning off the tap while you brush teeth can save 2-3 gallons of water per day! **That's 60-90 gallons per person per month!** A family of 4 could save 240-360 gallons a month.





Unlimited bundles of brush and craft paper bags of yard waste (leaves, grass, etc.)!

TDS REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET TO BE PICKED UP. THE REQUIREMENTS ARE: ALL BRUSH AND LIMBS MUST BE BUNDLED OR BAGGED, EACH BUNDLE MUST BE TIED TOGETHER WITH SOME SORT OF TWINE, ROPE, ETC. BUNDLES SHOULD BE TIED AND WEIGH NO MORE THAN 40 POUNDS AND MEASURE NO LONGER THAN 4 FEET IN LENGTH. DEPENDING ON THE WASTE VOLUME, IT MAY TAKE MORE THAN ONE DAY TO GET THROUGH THE NEIGHBORHOOD SO PLEASE BE PATIENT AS THEY WORK THEIR WAY TO YOUR HOUSE.
