

## Please have trash on the curb by Monday.

Unlimited bundles of brush and craft paper bags of yard waste (leaves, grass, etc.)!

TDS REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET TO BE PICKED UP. THE REQUIREMENTS ARE: ALL BRUSH AND LIMBS MUST BE BUNDLED OR BAGGED, EACH BUNDLE MUST BE TIED TOGETHER WITH SOME SORT OF TWINE, ROPE, ETC. BUNDLES SHOULD BE TIED AND WEIGH NO MORE THAN 40 POUNDS AND MEASURE NO LONGER THAN 4 FEET IN LENGTH. DEPENDING ON THE WASTE VOLUME, IT MAY TAKE MORE THAN ONE DAY TO GET THROUGH THE NEIGHBORHOOD SO PLEASE BE PATIENT AS THEY WORK THEIR WAY TO YOUR HOUSE.




### CAN I PUT IT IN THE RECYCLE BIN?

# Where does Belterra's water come from?

**Step 1 – LCRA:** Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) manages water in the Highland Lakes system, which is the primary source of water supply for much of the Austin area. The WCIDs have existing long-term contracts with the LCRA for water supply commitments, which provide the WCIDs with the right to use untreated water from the LCRA Highland Lake system.

**Step 2 - WTCPUA:** Because Belterra is not located near the Highland Lakes, the WCIDs have each contracted with the West Travis County Public Utility Agency (WTCPUA) to withdraw and treat water to drinking standards. Under these contracts, the WTCPUA is responsible for delivering treated water to Belterra through its US 290 transmission line, which connects to each WCID's water distribution system. The WTCPUA provides these services to many other communities in North Hays County and West Travis County.

**Step 3 - WCIDs 1 & 2:** Unlike some other nearby communities, the WCIDs are wholesale customers of the WTCPUA. This means that WCIDs 1 & 2 are responsible for constructing, operating and maintaining the internal water infrastructure within Belterra and billing customers for retail water service.
